



Respected Customer,
Please find below some recommendations for screen maintenance during lockdown.



Make sure the auditorium is dry and aired regularly.



If possible run the projector for an hour daily to keep the moisture away from the screen.



It is highly recommended to clean the screen and do general maintenance as soon the cinemas are operational.



Project a white light and check the screens for any marks, spots or stains.



Don't do anything in case there are unexpected marks, spots or stains visible by naked eye. It is recommended to consult with experts first and act accordingly.

Don't forget to clean behind the screen where the main speakers are.

Steps to clean behind the screen.



1. Clean the speakers. Wipe them, don't use a blower or don't dust them in a way that dust might settle on the screen surface.



2. Cover the speakers and clean the rest of the areas.

3. Use a vacuum cleaner or semi wet mop and again not a blower.

4. Once the back portion of the screen is clean, you may start cleaning the front portion of the screen.



It is advisable to clean non coated screens with slightly wet, clean cloth. Work from the top to the bottom of the screen. Once completed cleaning the screen with wet cloth use another dry cloth to wipe off any excess water from the screen.



It is advisable to clean the coated screens using dry process, and avoid using any water or detergents. You can attach dry and clean microfiber cloth to a telescopic pole or similar object, to cover large surfaces easier. Use up and down motions and don't press too hard. Make sure your cloth stays clean, and shake it out between each motion.
